# TE REO MAORI GRAMMAR

(THE LANGUAGE OF THE MAORI)

- NO VERB CONJUGATIONS!  
THERE ARE JUST 5 VERB MODIFIERS  
YOU PLACE BEHIND THE VERB TO  
INDICATE ITS TENSE

EG. i WEHE AU KI TOKU iwi  
(I LEAVED MY TRIBE)  
PAST TENSE CONJUGATOR

# TE REO MAŌRI GRAMMAR

- VERB SUBJECT OBJECT WORD ORDER

EG. KEI TE HAERE AHAU KI TAKU WHARE

LITERAL TRANSLATION: AM GOING I TO MY HOUSE

TRANSLATION: I AM GOING TO MY HOUSE

# TE REO MAŌRI GRAMMAR

(THE LANGUAGE OF THE MAORI)

- VERB 'TO BE' DOES NOT EXIST

EG. HE TAMAITI KOE

LITERAL TRANSLATION: A BOY YOU

TRANSLATION: YOU ARE A BOY

**FRANCE: WIWI**  
[oui oui]

WHEN FRENCH ARRIVED
