

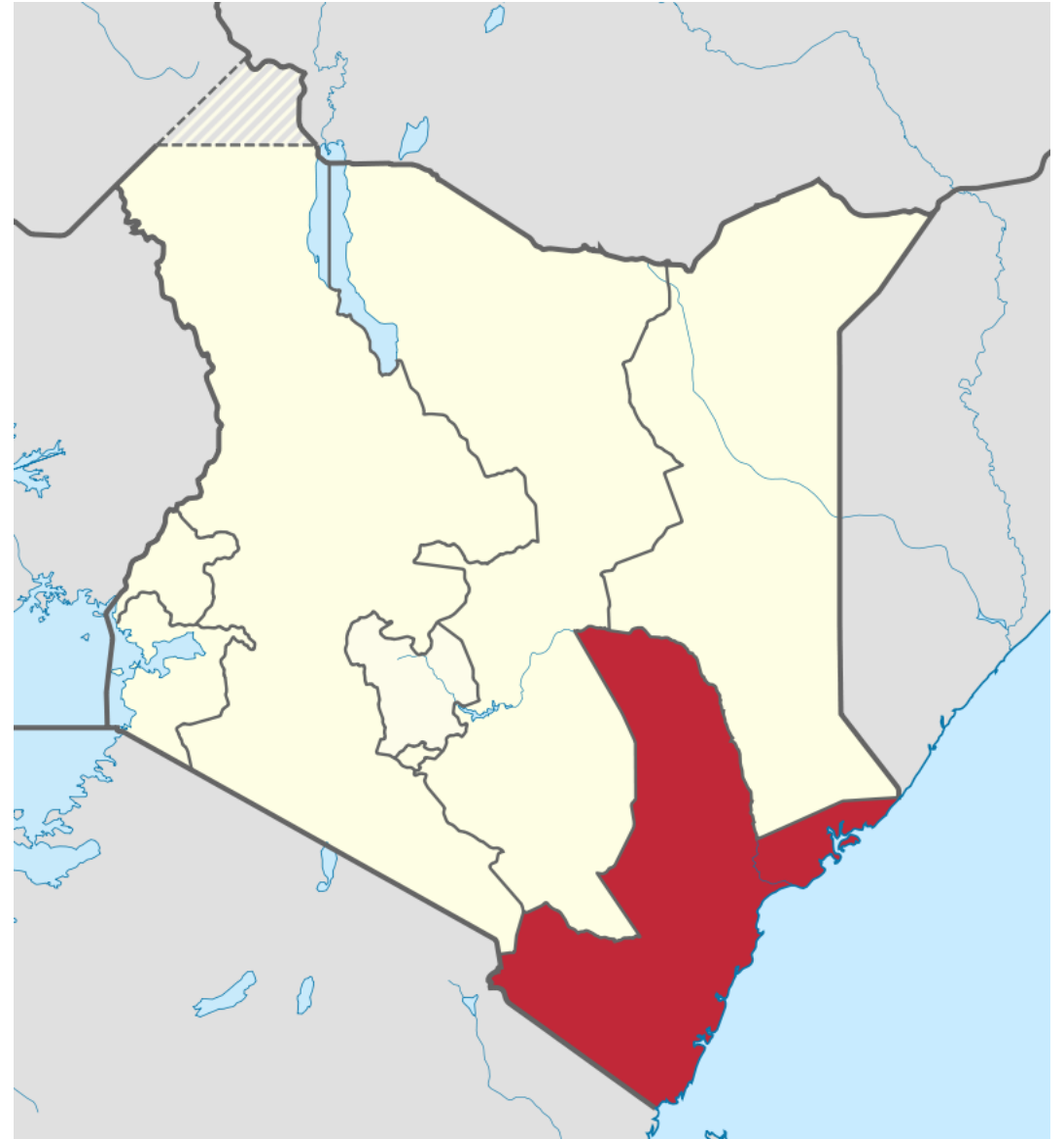

Countries where kiswahili is spoken



Kiswahili language belongs to the bantu group though it originates from an amalgamation of a bantu language with Arabic (40%) and some words borrowed from Portuguese.

For example

Arabic words in Kiswahili: *Rabuka, Maulana, Walakini, Rehema, ashara, ishirini, thalathini, mia, elfu* e.t.c.

Portuguese words: *meza, parafujo, gereza* e.t.c

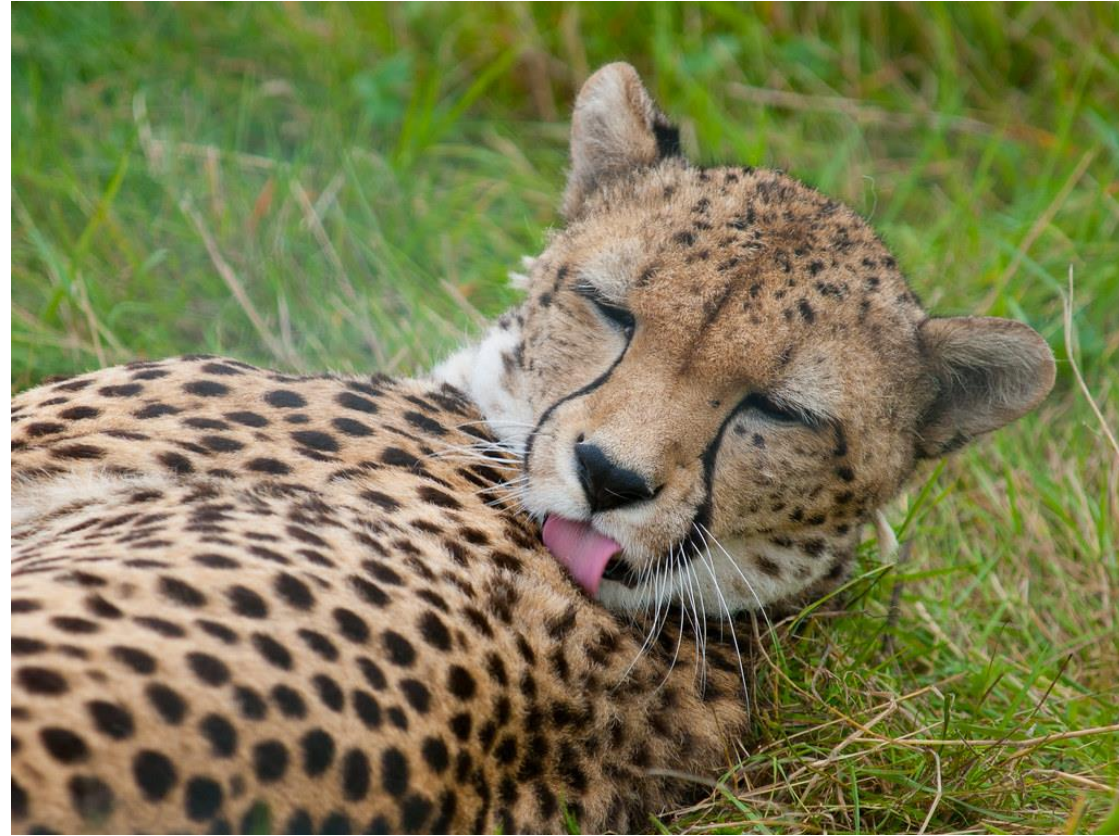
