

## Welsh Language

## Potentially up to 4,000 years old, Welsh is one of the oldest living languages in Europe. Welsh originates from the Celtic language spoken by the ancient Britons. ... Celtic language came to Britain around 600BC, with one version evolving into Brythonic which formed the basis of Welsh, Cornish and Breton.





## **The Welsh Not**

The "Welsh not" was represented as a piece of wood or plaque with the letters 'WN' hung around a childs neck who spoke Welsh during the 'school day'.

The 'Welsh not' was used as a ritual humiliation system or a 'Punishment system' to 'dissuade' Welsh children from speaking their aboriginal language.

At the end of a 'school day' the child wearing the Welsh not would be ritually caned for speaking their own language.

The practice was not ended until the 1940's.
